1. ABOUT GOD

Gen. 1:1,26,27, 3:22; Ps. 90:2; Matt. 28:19; 1 Pet. 1:2; 2 Cor. 13:14

- God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe.

- Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is co-equal with the Father.
- Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by dying on a cross.
- He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death.
- He ascended to Heaven's glory and will return again someday to earth to reign as King of Kings, and Lord of Lords.

3. ABOUT THE HOLY SPIRIT 2 Cor. 3:17; John 16:7-13, 14:16,17; Acts 1:8; 1 Cor. 2:12, 3:16; Eph. 1:13, 5:18; Gal. 5:25.

- The Holy Spirit is co-equal with the Father and the Son of God.
- He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ.
- He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation.
- He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right.
- He gives every believer a spiritual gift when they are saved. As Christians we seek to live under His control daily.

4. ABOUT THE BIBLE

2 Tim. 3:16, 1:13; 2 Pet. 1:20,21; Ps. 119:105,16; 12:6; Prov. 30:5

- The Bible is God's Word to us.
- It was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit.
- It is the supreme source of truth for Christian beliefs and living.
- Because it is inspired by God, it is the truth without any mixture of error.

5. ABOUT HUMAN BEINGS

Gen. 1:27; Ps. 8:3-6; Is. 53:6a, 59:1,2; Rom. 3:23.

- People are made in the spiritual image of God, to be like Him in character and are the supreme object of God's creation
- Although every person has tremendous potential for good, all of us are marred by an attitude of disobedience toward God called "sin".
 This attitude separates people from God and causes many problems in life.

6. ABOUT SALVATION

Rom. 6:23, 5:1; Eph. 2:8,9; John 14:6, 1:12, Titus 3:5; Gal. 3:26.

- Salvation is God's free gift to us but we must accept it.
- We can never make up for our sin by self-improvement or good works.
- Only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness can anyone be saved from sin's penalty.
- When we turn from our self-ruled life and turn to Jesus in faith we are saved.
- Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ into his life by faith.

7. ABOUT ETERNAL SECURITY

John 10:28,29; 2 Tim. 1:12; Heb. 7:25, 10:10,14; 1 Pet. 1:3-5

- Because God gives us eternal life through Jesus Christ, the true believer is secure in that salvation for eternity. If you have been genuinely saved, you cannot "lose" it.
- Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and keeping power of God that gives us this security.

8. ABOUT ETERNITY

John 3:16, 2:25, 5:11-13; Rom. 6:23; Rev. 20:15; Matt. 1:8, 2:44,46.

- People were created to exist forever.
- We will either exist eternally separated from God by sin, or eternally with God through forgiveness and salvation.
- To be eternally separated from God is Hell.
- To be eternally in union with Him is eternal life. Heaven and Hell are real places of eternal existence.

9. THE FAMILY

Gen. 2:23ff; Hebrews 13:4; Eph. 5:25, 6:1-4; Col. 3:18-21; Gal. 3:28; Rev. 19:7

- God has ordained the family as the foundational institute of human society.
- Biblical Marriage is the uniting of one man and one woman in a lifetime covenant commitment.
- Husband and wife are of equal worth before God since they are both created in His image.
- Parents are to raise their children in a way that pleases God and in accordance to His Word.

10. RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

Rom. 13:1-7; I Peter 2:13-17; Acts 4:19-20; Phil. 3:20; I Timothy 2:1-4

- God alone is the Lord of the conscience. Government has no right to claim coercive power of any individual's conscience.
- Civil government is ordained of God and it is the duty of Christians to render loyal obedience in all things not contrary to the revealed will and word of God.
- We are obligated to pray for our governmental leaders.

DLBC's Sexual Purity Statement

God desires His children to lead pure lives of holiness. The Bible is clear in teaching on sexual sin including sex outside of marriage and homosexual acts. Neither heterosexual sex outside of marriage nor any homosexual act constitutes an alternative lifestyle acceptable to God. It is God's will that you should be set apart: that you should avoid sexual immorality. 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8

While upholding God's standard of holiness, We strongly affirm God's love, grace and redemptive power in the individual who chooses to follow Him. Our desire is to encourage individuals to trust in Jesus and turn away from any impure lifestyle. We are not always perfect examples, but we do our best to live and conduct ourselves in accordance with Biblical values and instruction in order to glorify God.
